Meetings are held at Menheniot Old School PL14 3QS and St Mary's Church Merrymeet PL14 3LP. All start at 7.30pm unless otherwise advertised. Both buildings are accessible for wheelchair users.

Member of the public are welcome at Parish Council meetings, and can speak if they wish, during Public Participation, which is a 15 minute timeslot set aside at the start of the meeting. If you are unable to attend but wish to comment on the agenda, email the Clerk in advance and your comments will be included in the appropriate part of the discussion. ### How do I know what is going to be discussed?

We publish the agenda of our public meetings at least three working days beforehand so you can see what we are discussing. ### How do I know what has happened during a meeting?

We publish minutes of all our public meetings within two weeks of the meeting itself. You can always find a copy on display on the parish noticeboards. Copies of the full minutes from each meeting are available on the website or from Parish Clerk.
